Duke University Health System Decorative Materials Code Compliance Guidance

- 1. The amount of **non-combustible** decorations is not limited or restricted. Many printed materials can be done on glass, metal, etc.
- 2. Foam board shall not be used.
- 3. Elevator Door Wraps shall comply with UL 10B or UL 10C.
- 4. Exempt (decorative) materials include wall coverings, ceiling coverings, floor coverings, ordinary window shades, interior finish, and materials **0.025 inch or less in thickness applied directly to and adhering to a substrate.**
- 5. Specially manufactured products that meet Class A interior finish may be available as a substitute for combustible decorations.
- 6. Curtains and other fabrics shall meet the requirements of NFPA 701 unless specifically addressed in Fire & Life Safety OI 1-15.
 - a. Patient privacy curtains shall have a 70% open weave that extends at least 18 inches from the top of the curtain.
- Decorations purchased with the characteristic of being flame retardant OR those that do not exceed a heat release rate of 100kW when tested in accordance with NFPA 289 using a 20kW ignition source would be permitted.
- 8. Testing documentation shall be maintained and available for audit during any inspection by an Authority Having Jurisdiction (e.g., The Joint Commission, Durham Fire Marshal)
